# **JAHA to offer Boy Scout merit badges workshops**

***Saturday, Oct. 4 workshops to be held at Heritage Discovery Center***

JOHNSTOWN, Pa. – The Johnstown Area Heritage Association will offer two workshops to help area Boy Scouts earn the “Citizenship in the Community” and “American Heritages” merit badges. The workshops will be held at the Frank & Sylvia Pasquerilla Heritage Discovery Center on Sat., Oct. 4, at 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. respectively.

The “Citizenship in the Community” merit badge workshop, which is scheduled for 9:00 a.m., is a requirement for Boy Scouts seeking to become Eagle Scouts. The badge teaches scouts more about how their community operates, and how to be an active participant in it. Scouts must complete some requirements for the badge before arriving for the workshop; for details, see [www.jaha.org](http://www.jaha.org).

The “American Heritages” badge workshop will begin at 1:00 p.m. Scouts wishing to complete this badge are asked to choose two groups that have different racial, cultural, national or ethnic backgrounds. The workshop will include the Eastern European ethnic group highlighted in the Heritage Discovery Center’s permanent exhibit, “America: Through Immigrant Eyes.”

Each workshop costs \$10 per scout, which includes museum admission, program facilitation and materials. Individual scouts and entire troops are welcome to complete one or both workshops; those planning to attend both are asked to bring bagged lunches, including drinks. Registration may be completed in advance or at the door, beginning at 8:30 a.m.
